These concerns are real, and there is legislature being forward recently concerning the proper application and procedures for nutritional programs both in the agriculture and urban communities. A recent 6^{th} District court ruling will require EPA water permits for pesticide residues around water by spring 2011. EPA and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality are discussing draft

concepts for who would be required to get a permit.
